What we can do for you...

At Brockenhurst College we have everything you need to progress to higher education.

We run a range of Access Diplomas that are accredited by Ascentis and provide the ideal stepping stone to higher-level learning.

As an Access student you will normally study full-time over one year or part-time over two years. Importantly, we run a compact timetable to help you coordinate your studies with other commitments.

So why not join our learning community and share in these strengths to get to where you want to be?

Quality learning

All our teachers have expert knowledge and extensive professional experience. Each one is passionate about his or her subject and will strive to help you realise your potential.

We also keep class sizes small to ensure you get the attention and support you need to do well.

Support

Access courses

Diploma in Allied Health Professions

This diploma is ideal if you wish to progress into areas such as occupational therapy, speech therapy, podiatry or paramedic science.

The course will help you develop your skills through the study of biology, social issues in healthcare and psychology. **Fees £3,384**

Diploma in Computing

There are many exciting careers in the computing and IT industry, including those in software design, web development, digital marketing, systems security and network management.

This course will develop your skills through the study of computer science, web development and computer systems, giving you an ideal springboard for progression. **Fees £3,384**

Diploma in Humanities

This diploma can open doors to a career in teaching, marketing, journalism, and business and management. It can also enable you to study a humanities subject at degree level. As a learner you will study English, history and sociology. **Fees £3,022**



Diploma in Law

If you want a career as a solicitor, barrister, legal executive, paralegal, or in another related area such as criminology, then our Access Diploma in Law is the pathway for you. As a student you will study English, law and sociology. **Fees £3,022**

Diploma in Nursing and Midwifery

Success on this popular course usually leads to a career in nursing or midwifery. You will study biology, social issues in healthcare and psychology. **Fees £3,384**



Diploma in Primary Teaching

This course covers English, history and psychology, and is designed for people aiming to complete a degree in primary teaching.

We recommend you complete between five and eight hours of voluntary work experience in a primary education setting during your studies. We also recommend you already hold GCSE qualifications in English, Maths and Science before you begin your studies. This is because these qualifications will be part of the entry requirements for most primary education degree programmes. **Fees £3,384**

Diploma in Science – Pathway 1

This study option is perfect for you if you have an interest in biology and if you wish to pursue a science-based career. This could include job roles in biomedical science, marine biology, environmental science, veterinary science, forensic science and chemistry. As a student you will study biology, chemistry and psychology. **Fees £3,384**

Diploma in Science – Pathway 2

Our second Science Diploma Pathway is designed for students who wish to pursue a career in engineering, physics or maths. Possible career directions include engineering, product design, medical physics, geophysics and teaching. As a student you will study chemistry, maths and physics. Please note that students studying this pathway are required to have GCSE Maths at grade C (4) or above. **Fees £3,384**

Diploma in Social Science

This diploma provides the grounding for a variety of careers including social work, counselling, psychology, sociology and teaching. You will study psychology, sociology and social issues in healthcare. **Fees £3,022**

Key facts

Course fees

Fees range from £3,022 to £3,384. Access courses are free for students under 24 who do not have a full Level 3 qualification. If you are aged 19 or over you will be able to apply for an Advanced Learning Loan.

Entry requirements

To be successful at this level we recommend you already hold GCSE English and Maths qualifications at grade A-C (9-4). These are a requirement for students wishing to study maths and physics on our second science pathway and will be a requirement of many university degree programmes. We recommend you contact university admissions offices to confirm specific course requirements.

Preparation for Access courses

We offer several additional courses to help you achieve what you need to get into university. These may run alongside your course. However, you might wish to spend a year completing these preliminary phases before beginning your Access Diploma.

GCSE Maths (free)

GCSE Maths is required by most higher education institutions. Therefore, we recommend that you take this course if you don't already hold this qualification. A good grasp of basic mathematical concepts and techniques is essential to support work across the full range of HE courses.

GCSE English (free)

GCSE English gives you the opportunity to develop the Level 2 literacy and communication skills that are essential for further study and employment. It is designed for people who wish to progress to a high-grade pass of A*-C (9-4). This course uses a varied selection of materials suitable for learners aged 16 or over.

GCSE Single Science

A GCSE Science qualification is generally needed for careers in medical services, public and armed services, and for teacher training. This single science qualification will give you the opportunity gain a high-grade pass of A*-C (9-4).

Functional Skills – English (free)

This course aims to ensure you have functional skills in reading, writing, speaking and listening. It will also help you to apply these skills in both the workplace and everyday life.

Functional Skills – Maths (free)

Functional Skills in Maths is designed to give you essential abilities in numeracy that will allow you to work confidently, effectively and independently. This qualification also helps you to apply these skills in both the workplace and everyday life.

Advanced learning loans

Advanced learning loans give you access to financial support to cover tuition fees. This means that rather than having to pay for your course at the start, you can pay with a loan from the Student Loans Company.

You will only start to repay the loan once you have left the course and are earning over £25,000 a year.

If you are aged 19 or over you will have the option to:

- Pay the course fees personally.
- Have an employer/sponsor pay the course fees for you.
- Apply for an advanced learning loan to cover the complete cost of the course.

Advanced learning loans are for anyone who is:

- Aged 19 or over at the start of the course.
- Studying at Level 3 to Level 6 in further education or training and is resident in the UK.

Please note:

- You will not be eligible for a loan if you have already taken one to complete the same type and level of qualification.
- If you are aged 19-23 and are applying for your first Level 3 qualification, this may be free. Please contact us to check your eligibility.
- If you are taking out a loan for an Access course, you will not have to repay it if you then go on to complete a higher education qualification.
- Loans are available irrespective of your current employment status and will not be means tested or subject to any credit checks.

FAQs

How much time a week will I need to spend studying?

Full-time students will have approximately 12 hours of lessons a week. We then expect you to study independently for a further 12 hours a week.

Is it possible to juggle my Access Diploma with work and family commitments?

Yes. In fact, many of our students do exactly that. Importantly, we recommend you consider the time required so you can manage all your commitments.

I haven't studied for a long time, does that matter?

Not at all. Every Access to HE Diploma includes two units of study devoted to academic writing and study skills.
